Rehab Craft Cambodia

Rehab Craft Cambodia (RCC) creates employment opportunities for Cambodians with disabilities such as polio, HIV and land mine injuries. RCC does not hire on the basis of education or job experience. Instead, they are dedicated to providing training and opportunities for advancement within the company. RCC provides individual artisans with free business skills training and advice on design and marketing. Committed to the welfare of its members, RCC pays medical and maternity benefits to its artisans in addition to a fair wage. Members can also receive loans to purchase materials as well as loans for individual, family or emergency needs. RCC also pays for all expenses related to a given disability including prosthetics and wheelchairs.

Triple Pocket Planter Bag

Cambodian artisans use recycled lightweight plastic fish feed bags to create this innovative, pocketed planter. Bring colour to your balcony, deck or patio. Plant salad greens and herbs for a kitchen garden. Or organize your gardening tools and supplies for easy access near your potting bench. Breathable material is easy to clean and allows for easy drainage.



Special Details:

There are two ways to hang your grow bag.

- 1) Insert a bamboo or wooden rod in to the channel on the back, and hang on two hooks. The length of the rod should extend beyond the edges of the bag.
- 2) Use either the vertical or horizontal strips to hang the bag on hooks. There is some natural drainage with this material. If more drainage is desired, poke small holes in the bottom of each pocket.
