Committed to the welfare of its members, RCC pays medical and maternity benefits to its artisans in addition to a fair wage. Members can also receive loans to purchase materials as well as loans for individual, family or emergency needs. RCC also pays for all expenses related to a given disability including prosthetics and wheelchairs.
