Women in Bangladesh use handcrafted silk paper to create this colourful set of five tree ornaments topped with stars. Each is crafted by hand by women in Bangladesh. Prokritee creates and promotes income-generating projects that benefit the artisans, adhere to good safety and environmental standards and have the potential to become self-reliant.
